

College of Teacher Education (CTE), Kumarghat is one of the premier government colleges in Tripura, India. It offers a two-year B.Ed. program with the aim of developing competent and dedicated teachers. The college is situated in a sprawling 6.25-acre campus, just 1.1 km away from National Highway-44 and 500 meters from the nearby

Railway Station. CTE-Kumarghat provides a serene environment conducive to learning, along with unparalleled facilities. It was established in the year 2015.

History of the Institution:

The College of Teacher Education, Kumarghat (CTE) was established in the year 2015 which fulfilled the long-cherished desire of the people of the northern region of the state. Foundation stone of the college was laid on 11 October, 2011 by the then Hon'ble Minster of Higher Education, Sri Anil Sarkar and after that magnificent buildings were constructed to commence B.Ed programme in the college. NCTE recognition was obtained in the month of May, 2015 after the appointment of regular faculty members and then first batch of 100 students were admitted and the college began its journey on the 24th July, 2015 when the college was inaugurated by the Hon'ble Chief Minister, Sri Manik Sarkar in the presence of the Hon'ble Minister of Education Sri Tapan Chakraborty, and thousands of enthusiastic people of the locality and other notable dignitaries



About College:

Ambedkar College, a General Degree College under the Department of Higher Education, Govt. of Tripura and affiliated to Tripura University (A Central University), is situated at Laldahar, a village of scenic beauty in the bank of river Manu under Rajnagar Panchayet of Kumarghat Sub-division. The College was established on 26th September1991 with the effort and initiatives of education loving people of Fatikroy.

Initially the college was running in the campus of Fatikroy Class XII School, later on 15th August 1999, the college got its present permanent campus, which was acquired at the cost of vacating thirty-four families residing in that area who were being rehabilitated by the local administration in Govt. land within 1 KM from the college. Since the initial days of this college marked with the sacrifice of common men of this land and through years of struggles from various fronts, this college has grown to its present form, which comprises of 11.3 acre encompassing an old and a new campus and a sizable number of academicians along with impressive numbers of students.

The college is permanently affiliated to the Tripura University (A central University) and is recognized by University Grant Commission (UGC) under section 2 (f) and 12 (B) since 2010. The College has been accredited by NAAC, (National Assessment and Accreditation Council) Bangalore in 2021 with B+ Grade with 2.69 CGPA which was the highest grade in Tripura in 2021 and 2nd highest grade till date. The College is multi stream college having Arts, Science and Commerce. Considering the need of Science and Commerce Education of this locality, the college authority has introduced Science stream (both Physical and Biological) in 2019 and Commerce stream in 2022. The total students' strength of the college in 2023-24 academic session is 1807.

Academic Information:

The college offers four years under Graduate (UG) programs as per NEP 2020 i.e. Bachelor of Arts (B. A.) Bachelor of Science (B. Sc.) and Bachelor of Commerce (B. Com) both Major and Minor, in different subjects, viz. Bengali, Education, Economics, English, History, Political Science, Philosophy, Sanskrit, Physics, Chemistry Mathematics, Botany, Zoology, Human Physiology and Commerce subjects.

Besides these subjects, the college also offers Skill Enhancement Courses like, Vermi Composting, Mushroom Cultivation etc and Ability Enhancement Courses like Desktop publishing, Company Law and Practice, Yoga and Meditation, Physical Education, Indian Traditional Knowledge system etc.

The College also offers free Certificate and Diploma Course in computer learning under skill development Scheme. The programme is running in collaboration with NEILIT, Govt of India. For academic and cultural exchange, the college signed MoU with different institutions of the country like Central Sanskrit University, IGNOU, G.C. College Silchar, Assam, GDC Kanchanpur, ICFAI, Agartala etc.

To facilitate the working people of this region the college has established a study Centre of IGNOU.

For community service the college has a vibrant and active NSS Cell and the volunteers are continuously organizing different kinds of social activity round the year. Two volunteers and the programme Officer of this College has been awarded as the Best volunteer and Programme Officer by the Govt of Tripura in 2022 and in 2023.

The College has an active NCC wing under 13 NCC BN of Tripura.

The Principal In- Charge of the college has been awarded the Best Teacher in 2022 by the Govt of Tripura.

Infrastructural amenities:

The college has a well-equipped computer lab to provide the knowledge of ICT to the students. Four class rooms are equipped with modern and sophisticated Smart Class Room equipment facility as sponsored by UGC and NMEICT, Govt. of India and RUSA. The whole campus is being monitored by CC camera to control ragging in the campus and to vigil the campus. The whole campus is covered by Wifi with high end server and unlimited access with 100 mbps speed.

All the Science labs are equipped with modern and sophisticated lab equipment and online UPS.

For uninterrupted power supply in the campus three (03) silent Gensets are installed in three buildings.

For providing pure and safe drinking water facility to the students 05 nos of water cooler with IRP and filters are available in the campus.

One Language lab is also available for spoken English and Sanskrit. A wellequipped E Study Centre with wireless PA system, Smart Panel with LMS software and online UPS is available in the administrative block of the college for conducting Symposia, workshop and also for availing E - study material of the students

The college has a Central Library in separate building with digital access facility.


The College has a 50 seated ST Girls hostel within the campus to provide the accommodation facility of the ST Girls students.

In our Tripura, we have total 6 State Hospitals, 6 District Hospitals and 15 Subdivisional hospitals. Among these, we have one sub division hospital in our Kumarghat under Unakoti



district. On 26th March 2022, Saturday our Honourable Ex – Chief Minister Biplab Kumar Deb had inaugurated the newly constructed building of Kumarghat Sub Divisional Hospital. Honourable MLA, Bhagaban Das and other dignitaries were present at the inauguration ceremony. Kumarghat sub divisional hospital is a Community Health Centre -CHC. It provides 24 hours services; it takes care of routine and



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emergency cases. It has 30 number of beds and 6 numbers of Medical Officer. DR. Alok Dewan is the Medical Officer Incharge. Kumarghat sub divisional hospital also adopted Kaya Kalpa which is to promote cleanliness, hygiene and infection Control Practices in Public Health Care Facilities. To recognize such HI that shows exemplary performance in Adhering to standard protocols of cleanliness and infection control. Assessment was done to

improve the quality of care. Kumarghat sub divisional hospital has also started online OPD registration.

Health is wealth "is a common sentence that we heard about from childhood, which is true because our good health is our wealth. Our Indian government has taken various steps to build a strong nation by improving government hospital and medical centers. They have prioritized healthy lifestyles for the people of this country.

It is a very beautiful station and have natural beauty within it and surrounding it. It is one of the most busy station In Tripura. The platform is not well sheltered. It has many facilities including water and sanitation .But don't have facilities like elevator, AC rest room and fully sheltered Platform.




Kumarghat railway station is one of the important and oldest railway station in Tripura.




In 2023 the government has decided to make Kumarghat Railway station a modern railway station with all kind of facilities like elevator, Fully sheltered


The function began with a prayer dance performed by our young dancers and Sir Bipradip delivered the welcome address.

Sendoff to Sr. Lahun Marwein FS



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Examination evaluates students understanding and progress. Holy Cross School Kumarghat conducts all the exams in a fair and transparent manner by maintaining the instructions and guidelines of the CBSE board and Holy cross education Foundation (HCEF) in every session. In this session (2024-25) PT-I exam of classes I to class-X was conducted from 16th May to 22nd May. It was based on a combination of theory exam, internal assessment and practical assessment. PT-I exam of Pre-primary classes (Nursery to KG-II) was conducted from 27th June to 5th July 2024. Some of the subjects of pre-primary classes were conducted oral exam and some subjects conducted written exam.

Showing of answer sheets to the parents and students:

Answer sheets of Classes I to III have been shown to the parents and classes IV to X to the students on 20th June 2024. Answer sheets of pre-primary classes (Nursery to KG-II) have been shown to the parents on 9th July 2024.

Result and Report cards distribution:

Exam committee conducts pre-exam meeting along with the headmistress with regards to smooth functioning of the examination. Exam committee looks after question paper setting, making invigilator's duty chart, seating plan, attendance record, evaluation of answer sheet, preparing report card and declaration of result. During the meeting exam committee make sure that all stationeries like answer sheets, drawing sheet, graph, map, thread etc are available. Exam committee prepares timetable of the exam schedule provided by Holy cross education foundation (HCEF). Subject teachers prepared two sets of question paper for each subject for PT-I exam. After every test, exam committee submits a report to the principal. Exam committee also keeps all the records of each issue related to the PT-I examination.
