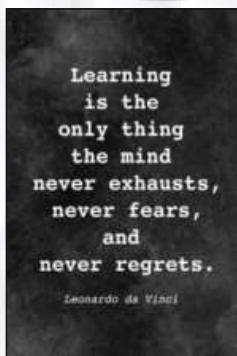

Good Samaritan Scheme

The Ministry of Road Transport & Highways, (Road Safety) Govt. of India has Launched guidelines of a Scheme for grant of Award to the Good Samaritan on 4th October, 2021. The benefit of the scheme is that any person(s) who will save the life of a victim / person of a fatal accident involving a motor vehicle (a) by administering immediate assistance and rushing to hospital within the Golden hour of the accident to provide immediate medical treatment to save his / her life, the individual / agency (b) would be given cash award of Rs. 10000. (Five Thousand) and certificate of appreciation by Ministry of Road Transport & Highways. Further, an individual Good Samaritan can be awarded maximum 3 times in an year and there will be 10 (Ten) National Level Awards for the most worthy Good Samaritans (who will be selected from all those who have been awarded) during the whole year) they would be given award of Rs. 1,00,000/- (One Lakh) each. The legal protection shall be provided as per Standard Operating Procedure of Good Samaritans law of Ministry of Road Transport & Highways to the good Samaritans preventing harassment on the actions being taken by them to save the life of the road accident victims.

The "Prahari Club" of Holy Cross School, Kumarghat conducted an awareness meeting on the topic "Evils of drugs and How not to be addicted" on 13th February, 2024 at 12 pm in a classroom. Teacher in-charges of the "Prahari Club" Ms Lalnunkimi Darlong, Co-ordinator and Asst. Co-ordinator, Ms Elvina Hoikhokim Baite were present with all the members of students' representatives. Sir Sandip Shil, Physical Education Teacher of the school addressed on the topic with reference to a deadly disease called AIDS. He explained the nature, facts, symptoms, causes and preventive measures of AIDS. One of the reasons for HIV+ is drug abuse. The bad effects of various drugs on the young community increasing day by day in the society. He also explained that the youngsters of the North-east region are in danger because of HIV / AIDS. The student's community comes together from various states especially the North-east and there is a risk of spread of HIV+ because of drug abuse. As preventive measures, everyone should do regular exercise for body resistance, good character and avoid bad company for their prosperous life.



Awareness of AIDS (Compiled by Sir Sandip Shil)

AIDS is a fatal disease for which there is no treatment available so far. This disease is spread by a virus called HIV which means "Human Immunodeficiency Virus". This virus destroys the immunity power of human beings. This virus weakens the immunization capacity of an individual completely. Thus, the body defense mechanism cannot fight against diseases. It means that AIDS is not a disease but it is the condition in which our body cannot prevent diseases. As a matter of fact, HIV attacks T-cells of our body, which act as a defense system. When germs of any disease enter the human body, the T-cells attack on these germs and protect the body so that the person could not fall ill. HIV attacks drastically on T-cells. In this way, the number of T-cells becomes very less gradually, at this stage, the person is called the patient of AIDS (Acquired Immuno Deficiency Syndrome). In this stage, if he/she is attacked by any disease, he/she cannot be helped. The symptoms of AIDS are persistent coughing, fever and sweating, reduction of body weight, dysentery, continuous infection even after the treatment of any disease etc.

Major Causes of spread of AIDS:-

1. Having unsafe sexual intercourse with HIV infected person.
2. Using the infected syringe for treatment and intoxication.
3. Blood transfusion without proper test.
4. Mother to child transmission is a common way for children to get infected.
5. Using HIV infected blade of razor.

Preventive Measures.

The preventive measures for AIDS are more vital than the treatment. Thousands of people will fall prey in the trap of AIDS in a short period. Therefore, we should have specific knowledge about HIV/AIDS so that we can be cautious and aware of this fatal disease.

The preventive measures are, such as:-

1. Don't have unsafe sexual intercourse with HIV infected person.
2. Disposable syringe should be used.
3. Proper blood test should be done before blood transfusion.
4. Avoid bad company of drugs.
5. Do regular exercises for body resistance power and to build a good character.



World AIDS Day, observed on December 1st every year, stands as a global initiative aimed at increasing awareness about the AIDS pandemic stemming from HIV infection.

Here are the key details about the health drive:

- Coverage: The campaign aims to reach 11.11 lakh children and adolescents between the ages of 0 to 19 years.

- Duration: The health drive will run from September 19 to October 3, 2023.

- Activities: The program includes various health-related activities and services to promote overall well-being.

Our Holy Cross School, Kumarghat also participated in this special health drive.



Under the supervision of Kumarghat District Hospital, Reports are given below-

For the National Deworming Day (NDD) program, a total of 1089 Al bendazole tablets were administered to children and adolescents (3-19 years) which is 100% of the children.

ORS, Zinc Tablets were distributed to parents/caregivers as per the dosage guidelines to 194 children (0-5 years) as a part of the Intensified Diarrhoea Control Fortnight (IDCF). The program covered 100% of the total targeted childrens.

IFA supplementation (IFA syrup/pink/blue tablets) was distributed to the population of 909 children and adolescents (6 months to 19 years) to consume as per administration protocol. Coverage for the IFA supplementation program is 100% .

Vitamin- A capsules (red & blue) were administered directly by frontline workers in the presence of the parent/caregiver to a population of 139 children (9 months to 5 years) as a part of Vitamin-A Supplementation program, which equivalent to about 100% of the total age group children.

The exam is an opportunity for the students to show their knowledge and skills and to identify their areas of strength and weakness. The exam also helps the teachers and school management to evaluate the effectiveness of the teaching-learning process and to plan for the next session. The exam also reflects the school's vision and mission of providing quality education to the students. It also informs the educators about their learners' progress. Following is the list of the major assessments which have been conducted in our school during the session 2023-24.

Periodic Test-I

PT-I Exam of classes Nursery to class-X was conducted from 10th July to 17th July and

the result of PT-I was declared on 28th July 2023. On the result day answer sheets of the students were shown to the parents and the report cards were also distributed to the parents.

Half-Yearly Exam (Nursery to class VIII) and Periodic test-II (class-IX & X)

The half-yearly examination for classes Nursery to VIII and PT-II exam for CI-IX & X was conducted from 9 October 2023 to 19 October 2023. The exam was completely based on the CBSE curriculum and the syllabus prepared by the HCEF for the academic year (2023-24). Minor subjects like G.K, Value Education, Handwriting, computer, and drawing exams were conducted on 29th October, 2023 and 30th October, 2023. The exam result was declared on 25th November, 2023. Answer sheets of Half Yearly Exam (Nursery to X) were shown to the parents and students on 18th November, 2023. Report cards from Nursery to CI-III were distributed to the parents on 25th November, 2023 and Report Cards from CI-IV to X were given to the students on 27th November, 2023.

Periodic Test-II (Nursery to class-VIII) and Periodic Test-III (class-IX & X)

PT-II exam of Nursery to CI-VIII and PT-III exam of CL-IX & X were conducted from 14th December, 2023 to 20th December, 2023. The drawing exam of PT-II of Nursery to CI-VIII was conducted on 12th December, 2023. On 8th January, 2024, answer sheets of the students were shown to the students (IV to IX) and classes Nursery to CI- III answer sheets were shown to the parents. The result was declared on 13th January, 2024 and Report Cards were also distributed to the parents.



Pre-Board Exam (Class-X)

Class-X Pre-Board exam was conducted from 13th January,2024 to 24th January,2024 and the result was declared on 15th February, 2024. On the result day answer sheets of the students were shown to the parents and students. After the result of the Pre-Board exam, Admit Cards of the Board Final exam was also distributed to the students. Class-X Practical Exam for Information Technology (I. T) was conducted on 5th and 6th February,2024. One External Examiner was appointed by the CBSE to conduct the IT practical exam.



Annual Exam (Nursery to class-IX)

The annual exam of the nursery to class IX was conducted from 1st March,2024 to 13th March 03/2024 Drawing and G.K. exams were conducted on 27th February, 2023 and the Value Education exam was conducted on 28th February,2023. Results of the Final Exam will be declared in the last week of March 2024, and the final Report Card will also be given on the result day.

All the exams were conducted fairly and transparently by maintaining the instructions and guidelines of the CBSE Board and Holy Cross Education Foundation (HCEF). The exam papers were checked and evaluated in the school by the subject teachers under the monitoring of the Principal, Headmistress, and Exam committee.

The exam committee along with the principal and headmistress prepares guidelines for the preparation of question papers for PT-I, PT-II PT-III, and Pre-Board exams. Subject teachers prepare two sets of question papers for every exam. Holy Cross Education Foundation (HCEF) prepares half-yearly and annual exam question papers. HCEF prepares Half-Yearly and Annual Exam timetables also whereas timetables for other exams are prepared by the exam committee, principal, and headmistress. The exam committee prepares proper seating arrangements for the students for every exam. The headmistress along with the exam committee prepares the examination duty chart for the invigilators.

The exam committee does all the processing work for each exam. The exam committee deals with all the matters of any kind of examination. Before every exam, the committee conducts a pre-exam meeting along with the headmistress with regards to the smooth conduction of the examination, syllabus, question paper setting, invigilator duty chart, seating plan, attendance record, evaluation of answer sheets, entering marks in the software, preparation of report card and declaration of result. During the meeting exam committee also makes sure that all stationeries like answer sheets, drawing sheets, graphs, maps, threads, etc are available. The exam committee prepares the exam schedule provided by the Holy Cross Education Foundation (HCEF). After every exam, the committee submits a report to the principal. The exam committee also keeps records of each issue related to the examination.

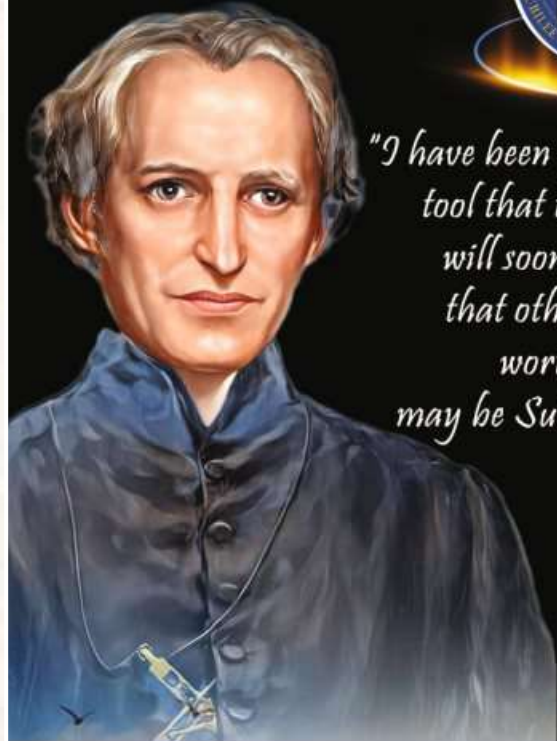

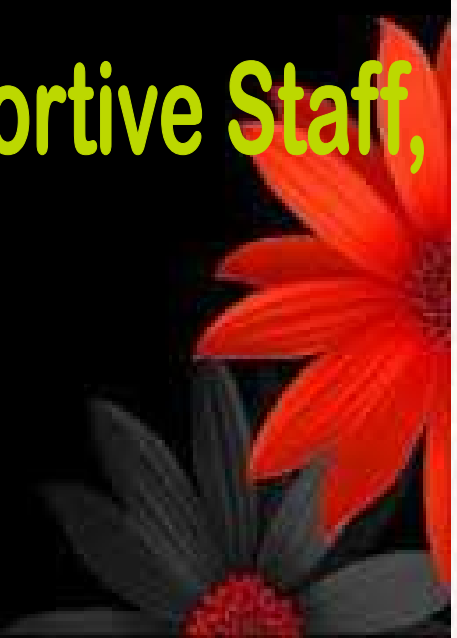
